

NDHU Scholarship Regulations for Outstanding Overseas Chinese Students

Article 1 This University has formulated these Regulations to promote internationalization and recruitment of international students and reward Overseas Chinese students of good character with outstanding academic performance.

Article 2 Eligibility:

- (1) Pursuant to the “Regulations Regarding Study and Counseling Assistance for Overseas Chinese Students in Taiwan” or the “Regulations Regarding Study for Hong Kong and Macao Residents in Taiwan,” outstanding Overseas Chinese Students, Hong Kong and Macao Students, or Hong Kong and Macao Students with Foreign Nationality who are studying at NDHU are eligible to apply for this scholarship.
- (2) Students who are officially enrolled at this University (excluding students who have extended study periods), have completed at least one semester (including students who apply for 5-year Bachelor’s and Master’s programs, and direct admission to PhD programs), and have not received any reprimands reprimand or penalties above imposed by the University.
- (3) Undergraduate students whose overall score for the previous semester is ranked in the top 20% of their class in their home department/institute and whose conduct score for said semester is 80 or higher.
- (4) Graduate students who have earned a minimum of 6 credits in the previous semester, whose overall score for the previous semester is ranked in the top 30% of their class in their home department/institute, and whose conduct score for said semester is 80 or higher. Priority shall be given to students who have not

been awarded the Subsidized Scholarship for Outstanding Overseas Chinese Graduate Students by the Ministry of Education for the said semester.

- Article 3 Scholarship and quota:
- (1) Scholarship: A full tuition and miscellaneous fees waiver
 - (2) Quota: 15% and 20% of enrolled Overseas Chinese undergraduate and graduate students, respectively, in each semester (the actual quota shall be determined by the review board).
- Article 4 Application method:
- Applications for this scholarship are available every semester. Overseas Chinese students who apply for this scholarship shall submit the following documents at the beginning of every semester within the designated time announced by the Office of International Affairs.
- (1) Scholarship application form (see attachment) (required)
 - (2) Original copy of the transcript of the previous semester (required)
 - (3) Class ranking certificate (in percentage) of the previous semester (required)
 - (4) Other documents favorable to the applicant (e.g., a recommendation letter from a department professor, competition award certificate, extracurricular activity leadership certificate) (optional)
- Article 5 Review method:
- The review board, which shall be formed by the Dean of International Affairs, the Director of the International Cooperation Division, the Director of the Admissions Division, and the Director of the International Students Division, shall select the best candidates for this scholarship based on the class ranking of the applicant in the previous semester and, if the class ranking is the same, the academic performance for the previous semester and other documents favorable to the applicant (each item shall account for 50% of the final score). The list of scholarship recipients shall be submitted to the President for approval.
- Article 6 Criteria and payment:
- (1) Scholarships shall be issued on a per semester basis. Eligible students may submit applications each semester.
 - (2) The maximum scholarship duration shall be the first four, two,

and three years of Bachelor's, Master's, and PhD programs, respectively.

- (3) Scholarship recipients shall receive a refund for tuition fee paid for the respective semester.

Article 7 Where it is detected upon investigation that the applicant has provided false information, his/her eligibility shall be revoked and the received stipends shall be returned.

Article 8 These Regulations shall take effect upon ratification by the Administrative Council and approval of the President.
